What is Academic Advising?

Academic advising is an educational process that, by intention and design, facilitates students' understanding of the meaning and purpose of higher education and fosters their intellectual and personal development toward academic success and lifelong learning. (National Academic Advising Association, 2004)

Advising Partnership

A successful college experience is based on a partnership between the student and the institution. Each partner has responsibilities:

Student Responsibilities

- Meet with your advisor at least once a semester prior to each registration period
- Come prepared with questions or material for discussion
- Turn off cell phone during advising sessions
- Clarify personal values and goals and provide advisor with accurate information regarding your interests and abilities
- Become knowledgeable about college programs, and understand academic policies and procedures
- Read/check your email and Canvas on a constant, regular basis
- Use GC resources, such as tutoring, writing and math labs and the Library
- Take primary and increasing responsibility for making your own decisions

Advisor Responsibilities

- Communicate the curriculum, graduation requirements, and college policies and procedures
- Assist you in gaining decision making skills and skills in assuming responsibility for your educational plans and achievement
- Maintain confidentiality
- Provide you with information and strategies for utilizing the available resources and services on campus
- Listen to your concerns and respect your individual values and choices
- Timely responses to your questions and concerns

- Access and use Canvas
- Connect majors with career/life goals
- Estimate study time for each hour in class
- Determine the semester hour and GPA requirements for Financial Aid
- Apply for graduation
- Locate transfer universities

- Verify your major on MyViking
- List questions and concerns for advising discussions

FAQ: Do I need to make an appointment to see an advisor? No, advisors see students on a first come, first served, walk-in basis in the Counseling Center. You may, however, contact your faculty advisor to make an appointment in advance.
