Application & Documentation

In order to satisfy GCC's admission requirements, the following materials must be submitted to the Admissions Office. Students should complete the admissions process prior to the day of registration.

1. An online application for admission. Proof of residency is required on the application.
2. An official transcript from an accredited U.S. high school (for students that graduated) -OR- G.E.D. scores (for students without high school diplomas) -OR- Official transcripts from all previously attended U.S. colleges.
3. **NEW STATE LAW requires all students entering college for the first time who are younger than 30 to provide documentation related to the Meningitis vaccination.**

Students who do not meet the above requirements and are 18 years of age or older may be eligible to be admitted on Individual Approval. New students entering college who do not have a high school diploma or G.E.D., must receive Individual Approval by the Coordinator of Admissions to be eligible for admission. Contact the Admissions Office for details.

International students must contact the International Student Advisor Brad McClenny (mcclennyb@grayson.edu or 903.463.8749) regarding admission requirements to Grayson County College. Necessary paperwork should be completed prior to the student's arrival on campus.

NOTES: Official GCC transcripts and financial aid will be withheld from students who do not complete admission requirements by the census date. Those students will not be allowed to re-enroll at GCC until admission requirements are met.

The GCC Application for Admission is available on-line and students may submit it electronically. Find it at: www.grayson.edu (click Apply Online). GCC accepts the Apply Texas Application for Two Year Colleges.

To "register" for classes students complete six steps:

- 1) Admission to the college
- 2) College 101 Orientation
- 3) Assessment of skills (Placement scores)
- 4) Advisement of appropriate courses (Advising)
- 5) Enrollment in courses
- 6) Payment of student bill

Priority Admission Dates: Students who submit an Application for Admission and all required transcripts, test scores, and Meningitis documentation (if applicable) by these dates will help assure that their registration process goes smoothly.

! *Financial Aid can only be awarded to students who intend to graduate from GCC with a degree or certificate. Also, all required Admissions documents must be received before aid is awarded (high school transcripts, GED copies or college transcripts, etc.).*

NEWS FOR HIGH SCHOOL DUAL CREDIT STUDENTS

Dual Credit Tuition Waiver Approved for Students Eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch

GCC now offers a waiver for high school dual credit students who meet the ISD criteria for free or reduced lunch. GCC will offer free or reduced tuition and fees for dual credit classes taken by high school students (in the GCC service area) who are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Students who wish to take advantage of this waiver should contact their high school counselor for details.

If you are a CONTINUING STUDENT:

(Attended GCC for academic credit during the previous 12 months. Most will be eligible for online registration.)

1. Ensure that student demographic information is accurate and up-to-date and that there are no holds on your record.
2. If you haven't already attended College 101 Orientation, sign up for it now to learn useful information and tips!
3. Meet with advisor to confirm your course placement requirements.
4. Select classes and register online.
5. Choose a method of payment and pay by the deadline noted on your statement.

Don't forget to obtain your Student ID and parking permit and shop for books.

If you are a "TRANSFERRING IN" STUDENT:

(Other college experience - earned at least one hour of college credit from U.S. accredited college.)

1. Complete application for admission online through the college's website and submit official transcripts and documentation, including proof of Meningitis vaccination (if under age 30). Apply for Financial Aid (online). Early application is encouraged.
 2. Sign up for and attend/complete College 101 Orientation.
 3. Complete skills assessment as required, or provide documentation of scores for appropriate placement or exemption.
 4. Meet with advisor to select courses. Bring a copy of college transcript(s) with you for best advising. Register online (when available)
 5. Choose a method of payment and pay by the deadline on statement.
- Don't forget to obtain your Student ID and parking permit and shop for books.

If you are a NEW STUDENT:

(No prior college experience)

1. Complete application for admission online through the college's website and submit official transcripts and documentation, including proof of Meningitis vaccination (if under age 30). Apply for Financial Aid (online). Early application is encouraged.
 2. Sign up for and attend/complete College 101 Orientation.
 3. Complete skills assessment as required, or provide documentation of scores for appropriate placement or exemption.
 4. Meet with advisor to select courses. Bring a copy of HS/college transcript(s) with you for best advising. Register online (when available)
 5. Choose a method of payment and pay by the deadline on statement.
- Don't forget to obtain your Student ID and parking permit and shop for books.

If you are a FORMER STUDENT:

(Students returning to GCC after at least one year away)

1. Complete application for admission online through the college's website to update your information and submit official transcripts and documentation, including proof of Meningitis vaccination (if under age 30). Apply for Financial Aid (online). Early application is encouraged.
 2. Sign up for and attend/complete College 101 Orientation.
 3. Complete skills assessment as required, or provide documentation of scores for appropriate placement or exemption.
 4. Meet with advisor to select courses. Bring a copy of college transcript(s) with you for best advising. Register online (when available)
 5. Choose a method of payment and pay by the deadline on statement.
- Don't forget to obtain your Student ID and parking permit and shop for books.

If you are a HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT:

(Seeking Dual Credit or Concurrent Enrollment)

Students wishing to enroll in dual credit or concurrent classes at GCC should contact your high school counselor prior to enrollment. Many courses are offered on area high school campuses. Eligible students may also enroll for courses taught at one of the GCC campuses or centers.

1. Complete Apply Texas College Application online through the college's website.
 2. Meet with high school official to select courses.
 3. Complete dual credit enrollment form and return to high school official.
 4. Complete skills assessment as required, or provide documentation of scores for appropriate placement or exemption.
 5. Choose a method payment and pay by the deadline.
 6. Complete Dual Credit Orientation.

NEW STATE LAW**Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination Requirements**

Beginning in Spring 2012, all new GCC credit and continuing education (non-credit) students under the age of 30 must submit evidence of being immunized against meningococcal meningitis within the past five years. The requirement is the result of the 82nd Texas Legislature's passage of Senate Bill 1107.

Applies to all first-time freshmen, all new transfer students, all new and returning continuing education students. Students who do not provide the appropriate documentation will be withdrawn from their classes.

Admissions & Records Related Information

Residency Requirements

For tuition purposes, students who enroll in Grayson County College will be classified in one of three categories: In-District Resident, Out-Of-District Resident or Non-Resident of Texas.

The following definitions briefly describe the residency requirements specified in Texas statutes and in rules and regulations of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System. More detailed information on residency classification may be obtained in the Admissions Office.

In-District Resident - A student who resides in Grayson County and who has been a resident of Texas for the twelve months preceding the date of registration.

Out-of-District Resident - A student who resides in a Texas county other than Grayson County and who has been a resident of Texas for the twelve months preceding the date of registration.

Non-Resident of Texas - A student under 18 years of age who lives away from his family and whose family resides in another state or whose family has not resided in Texas for the twelve months preceding the date of registration, or a student 18 years of age or older who resides out-of-state or who has not been a resident of the state for twelve months preceding the date of registration.

Note: Oklahoma residents are classified as non-residents but are eligible to receive a waiver of non-resident tuition and will be charged out-of-district rates.

Anyone who enrolls as a non-resident of Texas is presumed to remain in the classification as long as he/she maintains continuous enrollment. To appeal your residency status, see the Admissions MyPage Portal tab. It is the responsibility of the student to provide residency documentation and notice of residency changes. Residency changes are not retroactive. Changes are only effective for future semesters from the date appeals are received.

Change of Name and/or Address

GCC encourages each student to verify his/her demographic information using Campus Connect through the MyPage Portal. A student who needs to change their name should submit the change to the Admissions Office as soon as possible to ensure that communications are delivered correctly. Address and phone number changes may be made online using Campus Connect. Additional documentation may be required.

Maintaining Current Student Information

It is the student's responsibility to maintain accurate data on the student information system (Campus Connect). This information includes correct name, address, telephone, email and major. This can be updated through the Campus Connect (address and telephone) or in person in the Admissions Office. Failure to maintain accurate information could result in problems with a student's financial aid and/or academic progress.

Repeated Courses

When a course taken at Grayson County College is repeated at GCC, the highest grade attained will be included in the GPA calculation. Note: Courses taken a third time or more will have a \$50 per credit hour fee charged per state policy (Rider 50).

Necessity of Official Withdrawal

If a student, for whatever reason, ceases to attend all classes, it is necessary to officially withdraw in Counseling Services. If this is done by the given deadline for the semester, a grade of "W" is granted and the grade point average is unaffected. Failure to officially withdraw results in the grade of "F" and the grade point average is harmed. Students may withdraw from all courses via a telephone call to the Admissions Office or Counseling Office. Note: leaving a voicemail message does NOT constitute a withdrawal. You will not be withdrawn until we speak with you personally and all additional steps you will be given are followed.

Depending on the date of withdrawal, students who receive federal financial aid may have to repay a portion of their award.

Dropping a Course

To drop a course *after* the last day of Schedule Changes, students must go to Student Services. Students **cannot** drop a course by leaving a message on voice mail or online through Campus Connect after the Schedule Change period. Students must drop prior to the Drop deadline to receive a "W". Distance learning students or emergency withdrawals can seek assistance by contacting an advisor via email.

Canceled Classes

Any course or section may be discontinued if enrollment is insufficient to justify it being offered. Students who are involved will receive instructions on how to change the course and/or section or drop the course at the first meeting of the class in question. Students have until the end of the Schedule Change period to find a new course.

Transcript Requests

Official transcript requests should be made through Campus Connect on the MyPage Portal. Unofficial transcripts may be printed from your student account on the GCC website through Campus Connect. See the MyPage Portal and the Admissions tab for more information. Transcripts requested online will be processed in 24 hours. Requests made in-person will be completed in a minimum of two hours. Students without MyPage Portal access may request a transcript through www.studentclearinghouse.org.

End of Semester Grades

Students may view and print a copy of their end of semester grades using Campus Connect via the college's website. To access the file, go to www.grayson.edu, log into the MyPage Portal, click on Campus Connect, "view grades" and select the semester term.

NEW! State-required Meningitis Vaccination

State of Texas Limit on Dropped Courses (SB 1231)

~ ONLY affects drops occurring after the semester census date ~
Under section 51.907 of the Texas Education Code, "an institution of higher education may not permit a student to drop more than six courses, including any course a transfer student has dropped at another institution of higher education." This statute was enacted by the State of Texas in Spring 2007 and applies to students who enroll in a public institution of higher education as first-time freshmen in fall 2007 or later. Any course that a student drops is counted toward the six-course limit if (1) the student drops a course after census date or (2) the student is not dropping the course in order to withdraw from the institution. Some exemptions for good cause could allow a student to drop a course without having it counted toward this limit, but it is the responsibility of the student to establish that good cause. Students with questions should contact the Counseling Office or the Office of Admissions & Records for more information before dropping a course!

- Students that attended college prior to fall 2007, excluding dual credit/concurrent high school work, are exempt from this legislation.
- Students enrolled in dual credit/concurrent high school work are still considered first-time freshmen when they enroll in college after high school graduation. So students that graduated from high school in 2007 who previously took dual credit/concurrent work from any college are limited in the number of times they drop a course.
- Students under SB 1231 are limited to dropping 6 courses over their undergraduate careers while enrolled in public Texas colleges/universities.
- A total withdrawal from the institution is different than a drop of a single course and withdrawals are not to be counted in this statute.

Academic Fresh Start

Students may, at the time of their application for admission or readmission to Grayson County College, file for Academic Fresh Start (AFS) in the Admissions and Records Office. All academic course credits or course grades earned exactly ten or more years prior to the starting date of the semester in which the applicant seeks to enroll will not be considered in the calculation of the grade point average.

A student will forfeit the use of all credits earned prior to enrollment under the Academic Fresh Start Policy. Courses taken prior to this time will not be used in the calculations of the student's grade point average. The student's record will be inscribed with the notation "Academic Fresh Start Granted (date)."

Policies concerning AFS are applicable only to Grayson County College. They do not pertain to financial aid history or accumulated award limits. Other colleges may not recognize the reprieve. To request AFS a student must submit a completed application for admission, a written petition for AFS, and all transcripts or prior college or university work to the Admissions Office prior to admission.

Requirements for Health Science Clinical Course Entry

All persons planning a Health Science career must meet certain requirements mandated by state law or the clinical agencies where students are involved in patient-related activities. These requirements have been developed to protect both patients and students and must be met before participating in any required clinical experiences. In addition to the requirements listed, some Health Science programs may have additional requirements.

* Students in all Health Science programs must show proof of the following immunizations (or a positive titer) before participating in clinical rotations:

- Hepatitis B (this is a series of 3 shots requiring 6 months to complete)
- Hepatitis A** (this is a series of 2 shots requiring 6 months to complete)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- Tdap (within the last ten years)
- Varicella (Chicken pox)
- Flu vaccine for most current flu season

* Students in all Health Science programs must show proof of a negative tuberculosis test annually.

* Students in all Health Science programs must show proof of current CPR certification and will be required to pass a drug screen and criminal background check prior to attending any clinical experiences.

** Hepatitis A series is required for RN, Radiology, and EMT/Paramedic Programs only

President's and Dean's List Criteria

The GCC President's and Dean's Lists are awarded at the end of the Fall and Spring semester to students that have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their coursework. Students must be enrolled in at least 12 hours (full-time) at GCC during the Fall or Spring semester. Developmental courses, incomplete courses, credit awards and courses with "W" or "P" grades are not counted in the full-time determination for the honor. The President's List will be awarded to students earning a 4.0 GPA. The Dean's List will be awarded to students earning a 3.75 to 3.99 GPA.

In order to be released to schedule classes on-line the following students will be required to attend College 101:

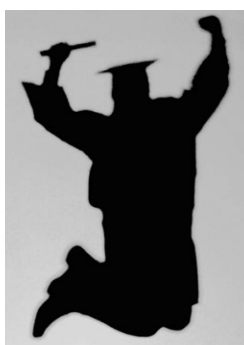
- All students who have stopped out of GCC for more than 3 years will be required to participate in College 101.
- All new students to GCC
- All transfer students. The number of transfer hours does not matter. All transfer students must see an academic advisor to initiate transfer credit evaluation and have a degree audit uploaded in Campus Connect. All transfer students who may be on probation at another college must visit an academic advisor prior to enrolling at GCC.
- All High School Students desiring to enroll in dual credit courses or any other college course.
- All probation/suspended students who have never attended College 101.

The following students will be exempt from participating in College 101:

- Students who have earned an Associate of Science, Associate of Applied Science or Bachelor's degree or higher.

College 101 can be completed online or in person. Registration is easy and FREE! Instructions for registering are provided in the email sent to each student within 48 hours of submitting an application for admission. Login to GCC MyPage portal, College 101 tab, for more information.

Graduation Information



Are You Planning to Graduate this Semester?

To graduate from Grayson County College with an Associate Degree, Associate of Arts in Teaching, Associate of Applied Science or a Certificates of Completion, students must:

1. Complete a Graduation Application form (available in MyPage Portal - Admin tab) along with an official Degree Audit obtained from Counseling Services or a faculty advisor. Students must submit their request to the Admissions & Records Office by the deadline published in the Schedule of Classes.
2. Meet the specific requirements for one of the degrees or Certificates of Completion. The division dean must approve substitutions, if applicable.
3. Have a grade point average of "C" or 2.00 in all work completed at Grayson County College, excluding developmental courses. Grade point average for Certificates of Completion will be based on coursework in certificate only.
4. Complete at least 16 hours, and/or 25 percent of coursework, at GCC
5. Complete all financial obligations to Grayson County College and have no outstanding holds on records.
6. AS, AAT or AAS Degrees require successful completion of all sections of the TSI requirements. Certificates of Completion require the WorkKeys

test or exemption based on TSI and a capstone exit exam or capstone course with a grade of 70 percent or higher. Some Certificates of Completion are TSI Liable.

7. Complete the Program Completer and Graduate Survey in MyPage Portal (Admin tab)
8. Complete the Post Enrollment Survey on the Admissions tab on the MyPage Portal.
9. Students that do not successfully complete the requirements for their degree/certificate must reapply for graduation.
10. Upon successful completion of all graduation requirements, the diploma will be mailed within the month following the graduation date.
11. There is no fee to apply for Graduation or to participate in the May Commencement ceremony.

NOTE: Academic rules and requirements are subject to change at the end of any semester and/or summer session. Individual academic divisions may prescribe additional standards of performance. Within five years of initial enrollment a student may graduate according to the catalog requirements in effect at the time of first enrollment, or any subsequent catalog, provided the requisite courses are still being offered and mandates of regulating agencies are satisfied. If a student fails within five years to complete all requirements of the catalog in effect at the time of initial enrollment, then the student will be required to graduate under the current catalog.

May graduation applications are due February 10, 2012 in the Admissions and Records office.

Assessment Information (TSI - Texas Success Initiative)

Texas Success Initiative

Texas law requires that all new students in a public college or university have their academic skill level assessed prior to entry in a college-level class. The assessment helps students understand their skill levels in reading, writing and math and enables them to enroll in classes that appropriately match each individual's skill level. THEA sample questions and information are available at: www.thea.nesinc.com.

Students will enroll under one of these four options:

Option One- TSI Exempt: Students must present proof of exemption at the time of registration.

Option Two- TSI Waived: Enroll in an eligible certificate program that allows assessment to be waived. Students enrolling in these programs will have their skills assessed on the Work Keys Assessment and may enroll only in courses listed on their certificate plans.

Option Three- College Ready: Students have fulfilled college readiness requirements when they meet one of the following criteria:

- Received passing scores on any state-approved placement exam.
- Received a grade of A or B in their exit-level developmental math, reading, and writing class. When student achievement reaches proficiency, students will be exited from any of the developmental reading or writing courses. (Please note that before taking an EDUC course or seeking enrollment in the Associate of Arts Teaching program, you must still receive a passing score on any state-approved placement exam.)

Option Four-Not College Ready: Students who do not have passing scores on all three sections of a state-approved assessment will receive an individualized Academic Success Plan. This plan will describe the sequence of developmental classes, retest requirements, and options available for students to demonstrate college readiness. Students completing their Academic Success Plan will attain college-level skills in reading, writing and math while beginning work on academic courses on their degree plans.

Exemptions

Currently, students may be exempt from the Texas Success Initiative if they meet one or more of the following criteria. Students must present proof of these exemptions at the time of registration. **NOTE:** *Students with a disability are not exempt from assessment requirements but may receive testing accommodations with appropriate documentation.*

- Transferred in from an out-of-state or private institution with grades of "A", "B" or "C" in designated courses taken within past five years.
- Students who have previously attended GCC or any other Texas public college or university and who have already met TASP or Success Initiative requirements.
- Active duty military (U.S., Texas National Guard, or U.S. Reserve Unit) in service for at least three years prior to enrollment at GCC. Some academic classes require students to demonstrate college readiness before enrolling.
- A student who on or after Aug. 1, 1990, was honorably discharged, retired, or released from active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the Texas National Guard or service as a member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the U.S.*

- Earned an associate's or bachelor's degree or higher from a Texas public college or university.
- Eligible test scores indicated below:

College Ready: Texas Success Initiative

Students have fulfilled TSI requirements when they meet one of the following criteria:

- Received passing scores on any of the approved tests, THEA, THEA Quick Test, Compass, Accuplacer, or Asset.
- Completed exit-level developmental courses with a grade of A, B or D.

TSI Waivers

Success Initiative Waivers are available to students who meet one of the following criteria:

- Students enrolled in Level I certificate programs of 15 to 42 semester credit hours (Work Keys assessment required for Level I certificates). Students enrolled in these certificates may take only courses listed on that certificate*.
- Students who attended a private Texas or any out-of-state institution during the previous semester and are currently enrolling at GCC on a temporary basis and not seeking a degree at GCC. Temporary students must present proof of enrollment at a private or out-of-state institution during the immediately preceding semester.
- Full-time students from private Texas or any out-of-state institution concurrently enrolling in one or two GCC courses (including distance learning courses) and not seeking a degree at GCC.
- Students enrolling in courses for self-enrichment only; not seeking a degree. Students may take a maximum of two courses on the enrichment list.

Not College Ready

All students who do not qualify under TSI options 1, 2 or 3 are Not College Ready and will receive an individualized Academic Success Plan**. Dual Credit high school students who have not met skills requirements in all three skill areas must pass the skill areas in which their desired college-level courses are intensive. (The class schedule lists course intensity in the right-hand columns). Concurrent high school students must pass all sections to enroll in courses on the GCC campus.

* Please note that some academic classes require students to demonstrate college readiness before enrolling.

** This plan will describe the sequence of classes, retest requirements, and options available for students to demonstrate college readiness. Students completing their Success Plans will attain college-level skills in reading, writing and math while beginning work on academic courses on their degree plans.

Assessment Information & Testing Schedules

College Readiness Requirements for Dual/Concurrent High School Students

High school students planning to enroll as dual/concurrent credit college students must demonstrate college readiness with scores from any of the state-approved tests, including the sophomore-level (dual credit students only) and exit-level TAKS, ACT, SAT, THEA, THEA Quick Test, Compass, Asset or Accuplacer before enrolling in classes. High school dual credit students are required to pass those sections in which their intended college level classes are intensive. For example, a dual credit student who did not meet the TAKS college readiness standard on English Language Arts and who intends to enroll in GOVT 2305 must pass the reading and writing sections of the THEA or Compass test to qualify for enrollment in this course. Dual credit students must check with their high school counselors for additional information about the eligibility to participate in dual credit courses (where students earn both high school and college credit).

Placement Test Options:

GCC accepts any of the state-approved placement exams for meeting initial test or retest requirements of the Texas Success Initiative. The THEA Quick Test and the Compass are the placement tests most commonly used at GCC because GCC can schedule test dates that better fit our students' testing needs. The THEA Quick Test is the same length (about 5 hours) as the standard THEA, but GCC personnel can access students' scores electronically in about a week. Compass scores are typically available the same day the test is administered. Compass essay scores are occasionally delayed for two or three days. Call the Testing Center at 903-463-8724 for more information.

THEA Quick Test

Students are encouraged to test early to allow time for receipt of scores and to meet with an advisor.

Reservations for the THEA Quick Test are required. Reservations will be accepted starting one month before test date. There are two ways to register. Students may register in person at the Testing Center by paying the \$10 registration fee (exact cash or check payable to GCC with driver's license number). Students may also register online at www.registerblast.com/grayson by paying \$13 (\$10 registration fee + \$3 transaction fee). Test payment of \$29 (check or money order payable to Evaluation Systems) will be required on the test date.

COMPASS Placement Test Dates

GED Examination Information

(General Educational Development) Grayson County College Testing Center

Located in the Success Center, Main Campus (903-463-8724)

Test Dates: GED examinations are given at GCC on most (but not all) Tuesdays.

Reservations: Reservations are required. Please call the Testing Center (903-463-8724) for an appointment to register for the GED exam. Bring approved photo identification, social security card, and full testing fee of \$65* exact cash to the Testing Center, Room SC 115. Allow at least 45 minutes for paperwork and instructions.

Test Description: The GED exam is comprised of 5 sections:

Language Arts, Writing	50 questions, essay	2 hours
Mathematics	50 questions	90 minutes
Social Studies	50 questions	70 minutes
Science	50 questions	80 minutes
Language Arts, Reading	40 questions	65 minutes

Residence Requirement: Must be a resident of Texas or a member of the U.S. armed forces stationed at a Texas installation.

Educational Status: Must be officially withdrawn from school unless enrolled in an approved In-School GED Program. Must not have received a high school diploma from an accredited high school in the U.S.

Must bring: 1. Photo ID: Texas driver's license, Dept. of Public Safety ID card, passport, or military ID card.

2. Social Security Card (if you have a Social Security number)

3. Payment: \$65 exact cash or money order payable to GCC or voucher from agency paying the testing fee

4. If 17 years of age, written parental permission and GED Test Administration Withdrawal form (forms available in Testing Center)

5. If 16, additional requirements available by calling the Testing Center

Passing Scores: Minimum score of 410 on each section and an average of 450 (on a scale of 200 to 800). Tests are scored by GED Scoring Center in Austin. Official Score Report is sent to home address in 2-3 weeks.

Retests: • Waiting period: For retesting on sections with scores under 410, a six month waiting period or letter verifying remediation from an adult education program/certified teacher is required.

• Reservations are required (see above).

• Retesting examinees must bring the same documents as first-time test takers. They must also bring a copy of their Official Score Report from TEA.

• Payment: \$10* per section, payable in exact cash or money order to GCC or voucher from agency paying the testing fee.

Counseling Services

Grayson College Advising Policy

Grayson College strongly encourages all students, regardless of academic skill level, to seek individual academic advising prior to each registration. New students are required to participate in the free College 101 sessions offered by the Counseling Center.

The following students are required to receive academic advising:

1. Students who are entering GCC for the first time.
2. Students who have not met skills assessment requirements.
3. Students who are enrolled in developmental courses.
4. Students who are on academic probation and/or who are returning from academic suspension.
5. Students who desire to change an academic major, certificate program, or transfer institution.
6. Students who are military veterans eligible for veteran's benefits.

Permanent faculty advisors are assigned to new students. Advisors and counselors assist students with career options, academic requirements, campus and community support services, and scheduling courses. Advising activities are designed to assist students in the successful completion of their needs and goals. Students who desire additional career assistance should seek assistance from Counseling Services. The Counseling Office offers information, assistance and guidance, with all services provided free of charge to current students, alumni and community agency referrals.

NOTE: Students who plan to graduate in May should visit the Counseling Center to complete a degree audit after enrolling in Spring classes.

Class and Career Planning

Students will find GCC's Counseling Services helpful as they make plans and decisions in various phases of their development. Counselors can assist with selecting courses of study, determining transferability of courses and choosing or changing careers. The college has professional counselors to assist students with class, career and personal development planning. Students desiring free career assessments should visit the Counseling Services Office. During Fall and Spring semester business days, Main Campus Counseling Services office hours are: 8 am-6 pm, Monday-Tuesday and 8 am-4 pm Wednesday-Friday. Offices are closed on Fridays during June and July. South Campus counseling services are offered Monday-Friday from 8 am-4 pm or by appointment.

Student Employment Opportunities

Assistance is available to GCC students seeking off-campus part-time or full-time job opportunities. Job openings are posted on the GCC website under "Getting Started", then click "Career Services". Who has a GCC MyPage Portal account?

All GCC students, faculty and staff have access to MyPage Portal. Login to mypage.grayson.edu for a listing of specific services for your affiliation.

What will a MyPage Portal account do for me?

The GCC MyPage Portal, "MyPage", is a one-stop access point to Grayson County College resources and online services including Campus Connect and Blackboard. MyPage will give access to important announcements, college calendars and online campus resources and more.

How do I get a MyPage Portal account?

New students will gain access to MyPage upon acceptance to GCC. All currently enrolled students have been issued a MyPage Portal account. ALL students must have an email address on file with the Admissions Office to retrieve their password.

How do I login to MyPage Portal?

Login to MyPage at <https://mypage.grayson.edu>. You will login by a UserName and password that is issued to you. Follow instructions on the HELP tab to have username emailed to your address on record. Your acceptance letter will include more information. Visitors (non-students) may access most of the links and information without entering UserName and password.

What is my Username? What do I do if I forget my username?

To retrieve your username, follow the directions listed on the opening page under Logging in to GCC Portal or choose the Help tab on the GCC MyPage Portal.

What is my password? What if I forget my password?

Your password may be changed/reset by following the directions on the opening page under "Logging in to GCC Portal" or by selecting the Help tab on the GCC MyPage Portal.

What is Campus Connect?

Campus Connect is your online link to your personal college records and registration system. This service allows students to view: current financial aid status, unofficial transcripts, current class schedule, current grade reports, billing history and balance, demographic information, as well as complete registration and related tasks such as checking course availability, add/drop courses, and online payment using a credit card, and more.

How do I access Campus Connect?

First login to your MyPage Portal. Click on the Campus Connect link (listed under Quick Links).

Online Registration (Eligibility and Conditions)

System requirements: You will need to have Internet Explorer 7 or Firefox 3.0 or higher.

- You MUST have attended GCC last semester or have completed the

Admission process.

- All monetary holds (parking tickets, etc.) or admission holds must be cleared.
- You must have your student portal ID PIN (available from the Help tab on the portal). Do not lose this code!
- You may register as soon as early registration is open for the semester. Refer to the Academic Calendar for specific start and end dates of online registration.
- Special cases will still have to be handled by the Admissions Office/Counseling Services.
- You must pay online or in the Business Office before you are officially registered. CHECK YOUR ACCOUNT!

Steps for online registration and adding/dropping courses:

- Log into mypage.grayson.edu and select "Campus Connect" from the Academics tab
- Select "Add/Drop Courses". Read carefully the online registration statement.
- Select the term for which you are enrolling (*NOTE: Winter minimester courses are considered additions to your FALL schedule; Spring minimester courses are considered to be additions to your SPRING schedule*)
- Choose the department for which you would like an available course listing. Click on "**List Courses**" and select desired course(s). Repeat this step until all of the desired course selections are made. When changing a schedule, be sure to "add" a course before "dropping" a course.
- To check your final schedule selections, click "**Class Schedule**" in Campus Connect Student Links
- To review your bill**, select the "**Pay/Review Account**" button
 - * You may print an itemized statement of your charges anytime prior to making your payment.
- Select the corresponding term code for the semester in which you are registering and "Submit". You will not receive a mailed bill. *Missing this deadline will result in your being purged from the courses you have selected.* Students may pay in the Business Office or online. **YOU ARE NOT ENROLLED UNTIL PAYMENT HAS BEEN RECEIVED BY THE DEADLINE!!!!**
- If paying online, select "Pay by Credit Card" and enter the MasterCard, VISA or Discover card information. Print the confirmation for your records.
- DROPPING a course after the designated Schedule Change period may only be completed through Student Services offices.

How do I access Blackboard?

Quick Tip

For students using Campus Connect
 When enrolling in a class that also requires a lab class, enroll in the lab class first. Also, if taking a developmental course, enroll in that course first. If currently enrolled in a pre-requisite class, you may need to register on-site rather than on-line. (The system will not recognize the pre-requisite course until the semester is complete.)

Financial Assistance Information

The Office of Financial Aid (OFA) at Grayson County College is available to help eligible students meet the cost of attending college. Based on the determination of the federal Department of Education, the primary responsibility of financing an education rests with students and their families; however, scholarships, grants, loans, work opportunities and other financial benefits are available to students who qualify for these programs.

All federal financial aid is awarded in strict compliance with federal regulations, state regulations and institutional policies and procedures. Priority is given to students with the greatest documented financial need who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit by the priority dates.

You may access the website to complete the FAFSA through GCC's website, select Financial Aid in Quick Links. If a student is considered dependant based on Department of Education policies, then both the student and the parent must obtain a separate PIN number and both must sign the FAFSA. If the FAFSA is not signed appropriately, it may delay the processing of the FAFSA.

Important information for completing the FAFSA
Grayson County College's school code is 003570.

The Department of Education will review the information you provide on the FAFSA and use it in their formula to determine your individual level of eligibility for aid. At that point the information will be sent to GCC. Once we receive the information the Office of Financial Aid will put together an aid 'package' for you. This package will be based on your individual needs and circumstances, as well as availability of funds from one or more sources. The aid package information will be posted to Campus Connect and available for you to view.

Students whose award amount information is posted in Campus Connect by the following dates will be allowed to use their federal and/or state assistance during registration: Fall semester – June 1; Spring semester – October 1; Summer semesters – May 1. For more information about requirements, qualifications, application deadlines, required satisfactory progress and application for all financial aid and scholarships may be obtained in the Financial Aid office located in the Administrative Services Building or on GCC's website: www.grayson.edu.

PLEASE NOTE: Each student seeking federal and/or state financial aid must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on an annual basis.

The level of federal and/or state financial aid provided to students is based on demonstrated financial need. This is the difference between the reasonable cost of attending college for one year and the estimated family financial contributions as determined by a federal review of the FAFSA.

Disbursement dates for federal aid are on GCC's website under Financial Aid Important Dates. To determine if you are eligible to receive a refund,

review your account in Campus Connect, www.grayson.edu. In order to receive financial aid on the disbursement date, students are responsible for enrolling in direct deposit (if desired) and to ensure the following:

- a correct mailing address must be on your Admissions file,
- check that there is no HOLD placed on your record
- complete entrance and/or exit counseling and an MPN if you have a Student or PLUS Loan
- ensure that your Admissions File is complete and you have selected an Educational Objective that qualifies for financial aid.
- your Admissions file must contain all requested documentation.

GCC's Office of Financial Aid accepts no responsibility for billings, refund checks, direct deposits, or correspondence from this office that is sent to an incorrect address or difficulties caused by the postal service or other delivery method.

TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

There are four major need-based federal financial aid programs. These include:

- the Federal Pell Grant,
- Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant program
- Federal College Work Study,
- the Federal Stafford Loan program.

Grants do not have to be paid back if the student meets all the requirements under which the money was awarded. Federal Work Study provides an opportunity for the student to work at the college or other educational facility to earn a bimonthly paycheck. All types of federal Stafford Loans must be paid back according to the terms of the loan.

State of Texas financial aid programs include many special grants and exemptions for Texas residents. Information about this type of aid is available at www.collegefortexans.com.

GRANT PROGRAMS

Title IV Federal Pell Grant: The Title IV Federal Pell Grant Program was designed to provide many students the opportunity to attend college. Grants are based on financial need and are awarded to eligible students enrolled and accepted in an approved GCC degree or certificate program. The length of these grants is generally limited to the time required to complete an undergraduate course of study.

- *Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Policy (SAP) for Title IV Assistance:* The SAP for Title IV purposes is different than the academic policy for GCC. SAP information for financial aid purposes is available on the GCC website www.grayson.edu.

- *SAP Academic and Degree Plan Appeals:* Students who need to apply for either an academic and/or degree plan appeal for Title IV assistance may obtain the instructions and appeal form either online or from the Financial Aid office. Once the appropriate documentation is received the Financial Aid office has 30 days to review and respond to the request. Students whose appeals are approved must meet criteria defined in the appeal. Failure to do so will return the student to suspension.

- *Special Circumstances for Title IV Assistance:* Students wishing to make application for a Special Circumstance may obtain the instructions

and form either online or from the Financial Aid office. Once the office has received the appropriate documentation; the office has 30 days to review and respond to the request. Only circumstances or mitigating factors beyond the student or student's family control are considered.

OTHER GRANTS

LOAN PROGRAMS

Federal Direct Loan Program: to apply for loans a student must complete: a FAFSA, a loan application and a Master Promissory Note. Once approved, the student must complete an on line Stafford Entrance counseling session and at the end of the semester complete Stafford Direct Loan Exit counseling. Loans are approved on an annual basis and students must reapply each year. Student loans are NOT available for minimester and/or fast track classes due to the length of the program and/or semester.

Several loan programs are available. The GCC website and OFA have additional information on each of the following:

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Students that apply for Federal or State work study must complete the FAFSA and a Work Study Application. This form is available on the GCC website or in the Financial Aid office. All applicants must agree to a background check.

TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID EXEMPTIONS

Exemptions are a type of financial assistance allowing some Texas residents to attend a public college or university in Texas without paying tuition or in some cases, tuition and fees. Visit the GCC website of the OFA for more information.

Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services/Division for Rehabilitation Services (DAR): DAR offers assistance with tuition and required fees to students who have certain physical or emotional handicaps, provided the vocational objective selected by the student with disabilities has been approved by the appropriate representative of the commission. Through this state agency, other rehabilitation services are available to assist students with disabilities to become employable. Applications for assistance must be submitted to the local Texas Rehabilitation Commission.

Veterans Administration Benefits: GCC provides a Veterans Affairs Office to assist the enrollment of veterans, war orphans, war widows, and disabled veterans, their wives and children. This office serves as a liaison between GCC and the Veterans Administration and is located in the Administration Services Building. Advising for all veterans programs is available in the Counseling Service Office. Please contact the Veterans Affairs Counselor for information concerning the required

documents. Students who have applied for a student loan and receive Veteran Benefits must be advised their student loan eligibility may be reduced depending upon the benefits received from the Veterans Administration programs. Please consult the Financial Aid office for additional information.

IMPORTANT Note to All Students:

- Students that are in default on a federal student loan or have an outstanding Return to Title IV (R2T4) are not eligible to receive grants or loans until the issue is resolved. Documentation from the appropriate agency is required to continue the process on your paperwork.
- If you are applying for a student loan and enrolled in less than 6 semester hours at the time of disbursement you are not eligible and will not receive your requested loan proceeds.
- Continuing Education programs are not approved for any Title IV assistance.

WHAT IS R2T4?

If a portion of the assistance received is 'unearned' by the student, it must be returned to the federal program:

1. Federal Stafford Loan Program
2. Federal Parent Loan Program (PLUS)
3. Federal Pell Grant Program
4. Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Education Grant Program
5. Other Title IV programs
6. Other Federal, State, Private and/or Institutional student aid.

If you withdraw before the 60% completion point of any semester for which you received assistance, it is likely you will owe a repayment of unearned financial aid funds. GCC Financial Aid office will notify you by letter indicating the amount owed to the Department of Education and/or the College. These funds must be repaid in order to receive Title IV assistance at GCC and/or another institution. A hold will be placed on your academic transcripts until the account is paid in full.

Financial Aid can only be awarded to students who intend to graduate from GCC with a degree or certificate. Also, all required Admissions documents must be received before aid is awarded (high school transcripts, GED copies or college transcripts).

Payment Information and Options

Tuition and Fees Payment

A student is not officially registered until payment is made in full. Students must pay fees by the time and date listed on the registration statement provided at the time of enrolling in classes. Tuition may be paid with cash, check, MasterCard, Visa or Discover, and may be paid in person or on-line.

Pay In Full

Students using 'pay in full by credit card' on the Review/Pay Account page in Campus Connect are not charged a separate fee.

Students who need/qualify for other financial assistance should contact the Financial Aid Office **early**. Students may use their Campus Connect account to follow their financial aid status.

Installment Plan

A payment plan system is available for students to payout their tuition before classes begin. To help students meet educational expenses, GCC offers an automatic payment plan that can be set up to use a bank account or credit/debit card. Students interested in this method of payment should click the e-Cashier Payment Plan button on the Review/Pay Account page in Campus Connect. To participate in FACTS (also known as e-Cashier) an account must be established.

FACTS/Nelnet provides a low-cost option for budgeting tuition. It is not a loan program. All payment plans are legal contracts with Nelnet Business Solutions. It allows installments toward tuition to be paid automatically on a monthly basis. The earlier a student registers for classes, the longer the payment period. See the payment plan information on this page.

Cost to Participate: To use the payment plan there is a \$30 per semester (non-refundable) enrollment fee for payments made through ACH (automatic bank payment) or credit card. There is a \$30 returned payment fee everytime a payment is returned.

Another option is to use e-Cashier to pay the tuition in full with a checking or savings account or credit/debit card. There is a \$2 enrollment fee.

To Enroll in the Payment Plan

- Go to mypage.grayson.edu
- Log in with username and password (Campus Connect) and select Pay/Review Account - select the correct term for which you are paying and click Submit
- Choose e-Cashier Payment Plan. When setting up payment plan be sure to include a current email address so you will receive copies of all the e-cashier contract information

FINANCIAL AID STUDENTS

All students receiving federal financial assistance must have official transcripts from all previously attended colleges on file in the Admissions Office before funds can be distributed.

Note: Payments are processed on the 5th of each month and will continue automatically until the balance is paid in full. If payment is not successful on the 5th it will be re-attempted on the 20th and a \$30 fee will be assessed by FACTS/Nelnet. The \$30 fee will be charged for each unsuccessful attempt. All down and full payments, and the \$30 enrollment fee, are processed immediately. Also note that payments will not show on Campus Connect until the funds actually reach the college's bank. This can take 3 days for credit cards and up to 10 days for bank transfers. If the down payment fails, the contract will be terminated, and you may be required to pay in full.

Students Who Receive Financial Aid: Your e-Cashier balance cannot be reduced until PELL is awarded or loan funds are actually disbursed to the school. If this happens less than 5 days before a payment is due the balance cannot be changed before the payment is taken.

Tuition Exemptions

Available for blind or deaf students, adopted students, eligible dual credit high school students, veterans, veterans' surviving children, children or spouse of deceased public servants, children of MIAs/POWs, ex-prisoners of war, preceptors for professional nursing education programs and their children, children of professional nurse faculty or staff, children of disabled firemen, peace officers, firemen taking fire science curriculum, foster care students and the Texas Tomorrow Prepaid Tuition Program. Certificates of exemption must be presented at the time of enrollment.

Tuition Rebates

First-time students entering Texas public institutions of higher education may be eligible for a \$1,000 tuition rebate after earning a baccalaureate degree from a Texas public university. To be eligible for the rebate, a student must have attempted no more than three hours in excess of the minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete the degree in the catalog under which they graduated, and be a Texas resident. Community college students hoping to qualify for the rebate should check with academic advising at the Texas university where they plan to transfer to be sure the courses they are taking will apply to the university degree program they are pursuing. For additional eligibility information contact Barbara Malone in Counseling Services.

Tuition and Fees

Mandatory fees include student services and general use fees. In addition to the fees indicated above, extension site students must pay an additional \$4 per hour facility use fee. Students will also be assessed parking, matriculation and student ID fees, and some classes have additional laboratory fees, which are listed on this page. The schedules of combined tuition and mandatory fees presented below are intended to assist students in estimating their educational costs. The following tuition and mandatory per credit hour fee rates have been implemented for Spring 2012.

Students at GCC are charged a higher tuition rate (\$50 per credit hour) for each course they repeat for 3 or more times. The “third attempt” course tuition rate applies to a majority of credit courses counting each time a student has enrolled in a course since Fall 2002. This additional rate does not apply to developmental education courses and repeatable courses.

A student enrolled in his/her last semester at GCC taking a course required for graduation will not be charged the higher rate. See the Admissions Office for more details.

Refund Policy

See the Academic Calendar for withdrawal and class drop deadlines that qualify for refunds. The College follows a refund schedule written by the state of Texas. Refunds are processed approximately six weeks after the first class day.

Vehicles & Parking Permits

Motor Vehicles On Campus

To enable the GCC Police to be of greater service to the campus community, all vehicles operated on a GCC Campus must display a valid GCC parking permit. To receive a parking permit, students should contact the Campus Police on the Main Campus to complete a motor vehicle registration form and pay a \$15.00 fee. Replacement and additional permits are \$5.00. South Campus students may receive parking permits at that campus' Administrative Office during registration days and hours. NOTE: Students should have their student ID card made prior to requesting a parking permit.

Notice: According to Texas Education Code 51.207(d), vehicles operated on college property must maintain current Texas motor vehicle inspection and Texas vehicle registration, when owned by persons residing in the state. Failure to maintain current Texas motor vehicle inspection or registration may be a violation of state law (Texas Transportation Code). Campus police officers, along with other patrol duties, regularly enforce state motor vehicle inspection and registration laws for vehicles operated or parked on college property.

Parking illegally on college property may result in a parking citation requiring payment of a fine (Texas Educ. Code 51.202). For example, violations such as parking illegally in a space reserved for the disabled may result in a \$50 fine. Other areas that are prohibited for parking are loading zones or no parking areas; restricted parking areas between specified hours; lawn or grassy areas; or other spaces specifically identified as no parking or personalized.

Campus police officers issue parking citations for violations of the college traffic and parking regulations. Should a parking citation be received, the person should contact the campus police office within 10 days of the date the citation was issued to dispose of the violation. Failure to adhere to the 10 day grace period will result in an additional late fee of \$10 being added to the violation.

These are brief descriptions regarding prohibited parking areas. To receive a copy of GCC's parking rules and regulations which detail methods, procedures and policies while operating a vehicle on campus, please contact the Campus Police Office. Bookstore Hours & Textbook Return

Main Campus Bookstore hours vary depending on the classes being offered. Phone 903-463-8631 for current hours of operation.

Textbooks and other required/supplemental course materials are connected to the course and its delivery method. Pricing for textbooks, ISBN information, and materials will be available on the college website, www.grayson.edu. Prices listed are based on the best information available from the publisher, but are subject to change without advance notice.

Books may be purchased at the South Campus from 8:00 am-4:00 pm during registration and the first week of class. Check with the Administrative Office for assistance at other times.

The bookstore will pay the wholesale price for used books throughout the semester. Used books are also purchased during exam week. These dates are posted in the Bookstore each semester.

Students needing to return a book must do so within 10 days from date of purchase and provide a current register receipt for the book(s). Books must be in absolutely new condition free of ALL markings. Tradebooks and special order books are not returnable. Bookstore personnel are the sole judge in determining whether books are in new or used condition. Should a defective book be purchased, it should be returned for exchange immediately upon discovery of the defect.

Support Services

The College is committed to meeting the special needs of students. Special services are available to students who are single parents, educationally disadvantaged, disabled, enrolled in non-traditional programs or have limited English proficiency. Agencies that work with the College and its students through this program include the Workforce Commission, Texas Division for Rehabilitative Services, Commissions for the Deaf and the Blind, the Texas Department of Human Resources, and others.

SPECIAL SERVICES are available to students who are majoring in a vocational/technical program and are single parents, displaced homemakers, or enrolled in non-traditional programs. Assistance is available for child care, transportation and textbook loans for those who qualify. Textbooks for technical classes are available for check out in the reserve section of the library. Funding, when available, is provided by the Carl Perkins Vocational Funds. Contact the Coordinator for Special Services in the Counseling Center for details.

DISABILITY SERVICES - In order for the College to provide appropriate accommodations, prior requests for special services are needed. New students with documented disabilities are encouraged to contact the Academic Success Center at least one month prior to registration. The College makes the following services available to students with documented disabilities: tutoring, note taking, sign-language interpreting, special testing conditions, recorded textbooks, scribes, special/modified equipment, and other services as appropriate. Students are advised to contact the Coordinator of Special Accommodations in the Academic Success Center (Main Campus), or the Coordinator of the Academic Success Center (South Campus) and provide necessary documentation.

Family Rights & Privacy Act

In compliance with the Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act of 1974, Federal Law 93-380, information classified as "Directory Information" may be released to the general public without the consent of the student.

Directory information is defined at GCC as: Student name; student address; telephone listing; dates of attendance; most recent previous educational institution attended; photograph/visual likeness; email address; and other information including major field of study and degrees and honors received.

A student may request that all or any part of the directory information be withheld from the public by making written request to the Admissions Office during the first 12 days of class of a fall or spring semester or during the first four days of a summer session. If no request is filed, information will be released upon inquiry.

Notice of Student Rights - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.

Grayson County College maintains general education records required by law. A student's records are private and are protected from unauthorized inspection or use. The Registrar is custodian of all records for currently enrolled students and for students who have withdrawn or graduated.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights with respect to their education records. These rights include: The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the College receives a request for access. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA. The right to provide written consent before the College discloses personally identifiable information from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. The right to file a complaint with the US Dept. of Education concerning alleged failures by the College to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Ave., SW, Washington, DC 20202-5901. The Registrar or designee will respond to requests for explanation and interpretation of the records. The Registrar is located in the Admissions Office, Administrative Services Building, Main Campus. Additional rights to review records are defined in 20 U.S.C Sec. 1232G and in the GCC Policy and Procedures Manual.

Access to Public Information: Requests for information should be made in writing and delivered to the Public Information Officer via fax, email, US mail or in person. GCC uses its fiscal year, Sept. 1-August 31, for tracking requests.

Graduation Disclosure

The Student Right-to-Know Four-year Average Graduation Rate Calculation for first-time, full-time degree/certificate-seeking students at GCC is 38%. The Student Right-to-Know Four-year Average Graduation Calculation Rate for first-time degree/certificate-seeking students receiving athletically-related student aid is 17% for baseball and 40% for all other sports combined. The Student Right-to-Know Four-year Average Transfer-out Rate for first-time, full-time degree/certificate-seeking students at GCC is 16%. The transfer-out rate for first-time degree/certificate-seeking students receiving athletically-related student aid is 58% for baseball and 39% for all other sports combined.

Student Info on Bacterial Meningitis

Texas state law requires new college students to be provided information about Bacterial Meningitis, a serious and potentially deadly disease that can progress extremely fast. Detailed information on the symptoms, diagnosis, transmittance, risks, complications and treatment of bacterial meningitis is available in the *Student Handbook* on the college website: www.grayson.edu, and in the *Residence Hall Handbook*.

Religious Holy Day

Pursuant to House Bill 256 (78th Legislature), students are not required to notify their instructors in advance regarding absence due to the observance of a religious holy day. Such students will be excused from attending classes or other required activities, including exams, during the time needed for travel and the observance of a religious holy day. Smoking Policy

To promote a healthy campus environment, Grayson County College does not allow the use of tobacco products in any college building. Effective June 1, 2004, tobacco products are permitted in designated areas only. Main and West Campus designates the parking lots, at least 20 feet from building entrances. South Campus designated area is posted.

Student Handbook

Statement Regarding Drug-Free Schools and Campuses Act

Grayson County College is committed to maintaining a safe, healthy, lawful and productive working and educational environment for its students and employees. Studies have shown that excessive use of alcohol and use of illegal drugs and controlled substances increases the potential for unsatisfactory performance in class and on the job, absenteeism, tardiness, inefficiency, accidents and poor morale. As per College policy (Policies DHB and FLBE), no student or employee shall, in any campus area, possess, use, transmit, or be under the influence of any narcotic drug, hallucinogenic, amphetamine, barbiturate, marijuana, alcoholic beverage, or other intoxicant (as those terms are defined by the Texas Controlled Substance Act). Any student or employee violating this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action. Consistent with federal, state, and municipal law, criminal prosecution may also be pursued. The Counseling Services Office will provide confidential assistance to students and employees including making referrals to outside agencies.

Student Academic Integrity Statement

Scholastic honesty and integrity are vital to the ongoing interests of any academic community. Students have a responsibility to protect their work and to report instances of academic dishonesty to the appropriate professor or administrator. Any instance of plagiarism, collusion, cheating, or falsifying records, will result in an F for the assignment. Further action may be taken as needed. The same principle of honesty applies to the use of modern technologies, such as the computer.

Plagiarism includes: using three or more consecutive words of another without placing quotation marks around the words or without giving credit to the author; using another person's ideas without giving him or her credit; submitting another person's work as one's own.

Collusion is defined as working on any assignment with another person without the verbal and/or written permission of the professor.

Cheating includes: Copying work from another student; using materials during the examination not authorized by the professor/test administrator; substituting for another student, or permitting another student to take an exam in one's place; using, buying, selling, stealing, giving, or soliciting any assignments or examination material.

Falsifying records or evidence includes furnishing false or misleading information to any college office or representative.

High School Dual Credit Opportunities

GCC works with area high schools to offer courses for high school juniors and seniors who desire to complete college credit while in high school. These "dual credit" courses allow eligible students to simultaneously complete a high school course and a college course. The course may be taught at the high school during the school day, through video conferencing on-site at the local high school or on a GCC campus. Tuition waivers are available for students who qualify for free or reduced lunch programs. Check with your high school counselor for details on this program or for information session dates.



Academic Advising may be completed in the division of the student's major or in Counseling Services. This should be completed prior to registration.

A number of on-line services are available for students through "Campus Connect" on the college's MyPage Portal (www.grayson.edu). Students are given a PIN that allows each to access his/her own student account information. Many students are eligible to register on-line.

Distance (Online) Class Information

Internet-Delivered Courses

Distance Learning provides access to quality higher education courses via distance learning technologies. GCC has no limits on the total number of credits that may be earned by Distance Learning courses. Students who take Distance Learning courses have all the rights and responsibilities of on-campus students.

To take a course via Internet, you need a computer with Internet access. Students enrolling in any distance learning course (Internet or Hybrid) are strongly encouraged to attend one of the online orientation sessions to familiarize themselves with online courses.

Students who are enrolled in a GCC Internet course are able to receive technical assistance through the college's Help Desk. The Help Desk is available throughout the semester by e-mailing distance@grayson.edu or by calling 903.463.8788 weekdays and 903.647.0092 Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 6-9:00 pm.

Signing Onto Internet Courses

Students will be able to access their Internet course(s) the same day that classes begin on campus. Enrolled students should sign onto their course(s) the first day of class for the semester. Access your courses by logging into the GCC MyPage portal, click the Academics tab and select the Blackboard link on that page. It is very important that you follow the information and timeline provided by the instructor.

What is an "HYB" Course?

All courses noted with HYB are considered a "hybrid" course, which means that students come to campus for half the sessions and complete the other half on-line. The courses blend the traditional face-to-face, in-class sessions with Web-based activities. To be a hybrid offering at least 15% but no more than 84% of the content must be delivered via Internet. Unless otherwise noted, hybrid class students are expected to attend the first class meeting for an orientation.

Open Computer Lab Available for Use

GCC provides students and the general public a computer lab for use during regular operating hours.

Internet Course Participation

Academic success in Internet-based courses is closely associated with regular course participation, and students taking on-line courses are expected to be highly self-motivated. All students are required to participate in on-line courses regularly and are obliged to participate in class activities and complete and submit assignments following their professors' directions. Thus, it is imperative the student make the time commitment to check the course website regularly and complete assignments within the deadlines stated by the professor. Students should be prepared to spend at least ten hours a week during regular long semesters on course work and assignments. Students taking Internet courses during compressed semester time frames such as minimesters, summer sessions, and 8-week sessions should, of course, plan to spend significantly more time per week on the course.

Regular and routine participation is required to be "in attendance" in Internet courses. Students must regularly log in, turn in homework by required dates, complete tests on time, and complete other course requirements specified by their professors.

Students who do not log on to the course and complete required assignments before the census date for the course will be reported to the Admission and Records Office as "Never Attended" and may be withdrawn from the course.

In addition, students' eligibility to receive financial aid or live in the residence halls can be affected by withdrawal from courses.

The Office of Student Life, located in the Life Center, offers a variety of quality recreational experiences that act as diversions from the inevitable stresses associated with the college environment. Student ID Cards

A student ID is necessary for many activities, access to labs, testing and often makes you eligible for discounts with area merchants. Main Campus ID's are made in the Life Center; South Campus ID's are made in the Administrative Office. Photo proof of identity and a current class schedule are required. ID's will be made according to the hours posted on the college's website. There will be \$2 replacement fee for student ID's.

Residential Housing

Residence halls are available on the Main and West Campuses during the fall and spring semesters for students enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours during each semester. Room reservations are made by submitting a completed application, including the physician's signature, along with the damage/cleaning deposit. Room and board rates include weekly meals. Students new to GCC housing will need to show proof of their meningitis vaccination. Contact the Housing Office for additional information and current rates.

Reservations and payment must be made before a student will be permitted to move into a residence hall. There is no refund in rent after the student has moved into the residence hall. A student who is unable to attend Grayson College after making reservations may request a refund. The Housing Office is located in the west end of the Administrative Services Building on the Main Campus. Office hours for the fall and spring semesters are 8:00 am- 4:00 pm during regular business days of the college. Summer hours are 7:00 am-5:00 pm, Monday through Thursday (4:00 pm Thursdays). This office is closed on Fridays in June and July. Phone number is 903-463-8793.

Meal Plans (Fall and Spring Semesters Only)

The convenience of on-campus dining is made available through the Food Court. Students in the residence halls are required to have a meal plan, which is purchased through the Housing Office. The student ID serves as the meal card for residence hall students. Meal "cards" for the Food Court are available to all students and employees, and may be purchased in the Business Office.

"ZAP" Codes

These four digits allow a student's class schedule to be entered more quickly and accurately.

Class Notes

Classes that are available as either credit or non-credit are referred to as "mirror" courses and are marked with ##.

Course Credit & Numbering System

The number of a course gives the academic level and semester hour credit.

1. The first digit gives the level of the course.
2. The second digit signifies the semester hours of the course.
3. The third and fourth digits distinguish the course from others in the same department.

Example: ENGL 1301 is a freshman level course with three semester hours credit.

Grayson County College is a participant in the Common Course Numbering System in Texas.

Skill Intensity Abbreviations

The marks in the far right columns of the class listings represent the skill intensity requirements for that course. Skill intensities reflect the basic reading, writing and math skills necessary for optimum success in a class and are an integral part of the Texas Success Initiatives. In the example above, a mark in the "R" (Reading) column indicates the need for an acceptable skill level in reading.

Section Numbers

The college further clarifies various courses through the use of section numbers. The following list is a general guideline for section numbers. Some section numbers are used in combination to further detail the location, type, or timing of a class.

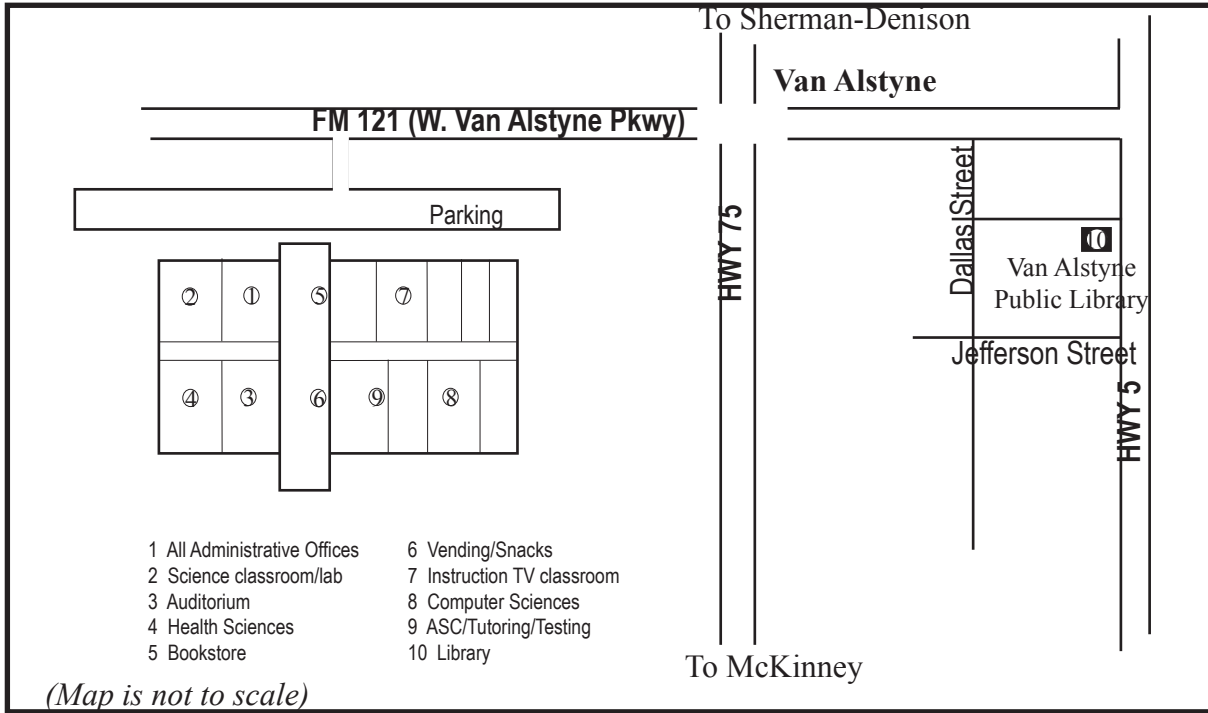

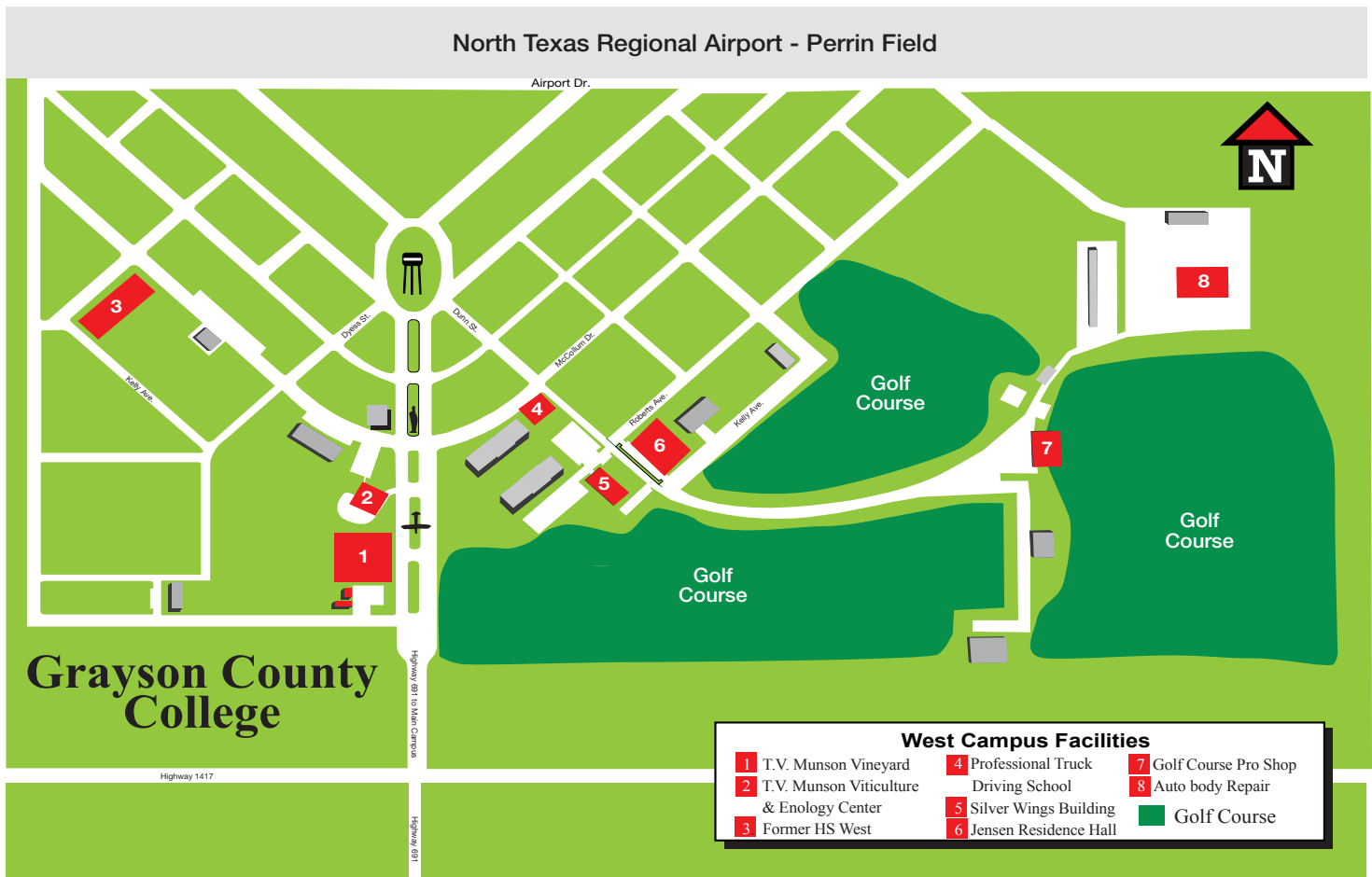

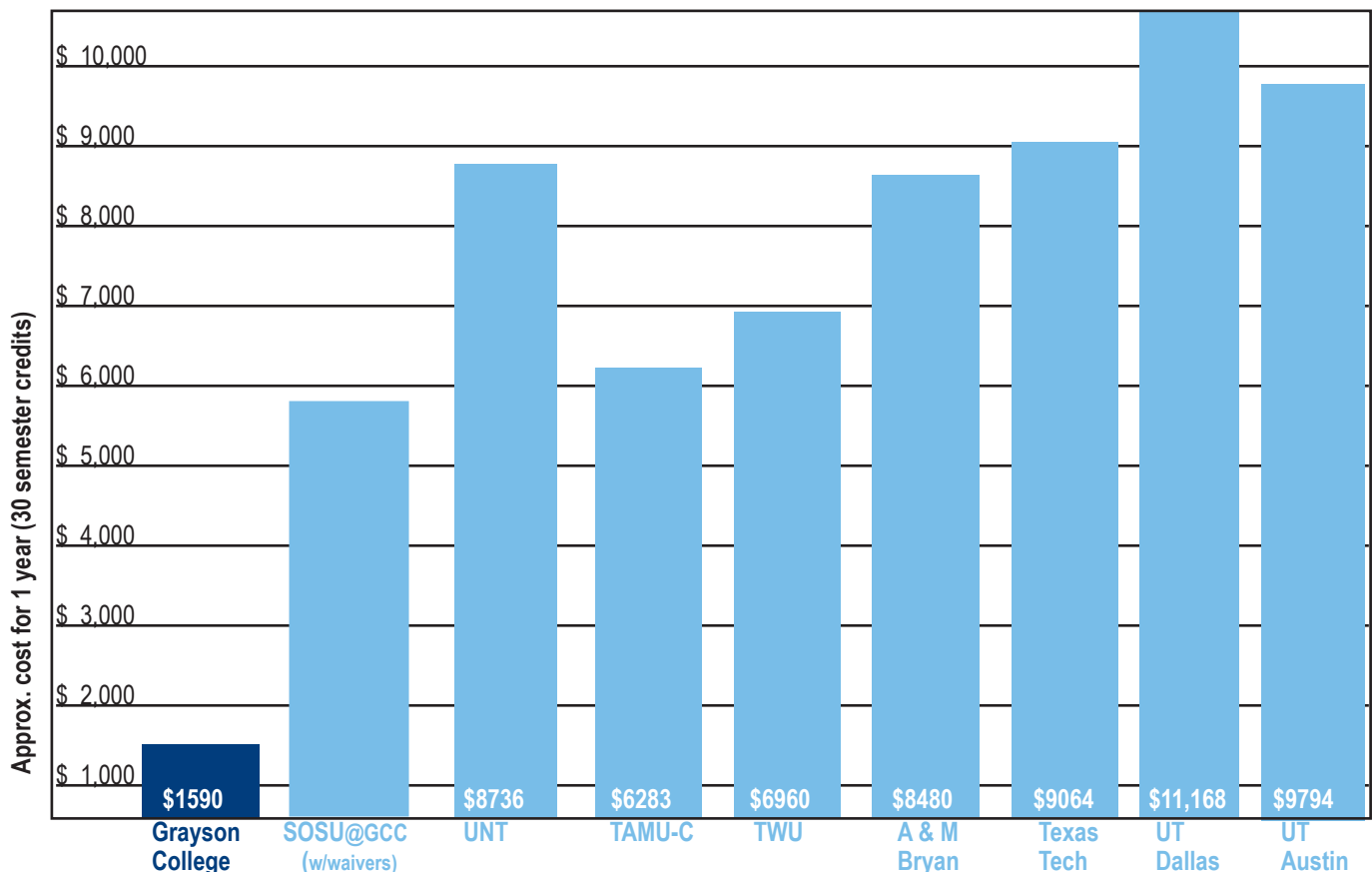
